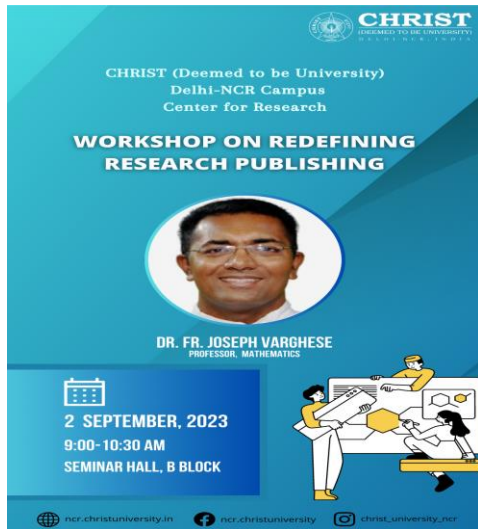

As a whole, the workshop proved highly informative and enriching, leaving attendees equipped with a deeper understanding of research publication practices, the pitfalls of predatory journals, and access to reputable databases for academic growth and integrity.
